



## **In Case Of Emergency:**

### **My Filling/Crown Fell Out**

#### **Filling:**

Call to schedule with your dentist. If your tooth is sensitive, place a temporary filling in the tooth. Temporary fillings can generally be found at a pharmacy. If you are not experiencing sensitivity, wait until your scheduled appointment to receive a new filling on the tooth.

Sometimes, when your filling falls out, it is due to a new cavity beneath that filling. In this case, additional treatment may be needed.

#### **Crown:**

If your crown becomes dislodged, you can place the crown back on the tooth with a small amount of toothpaste until you see your dentist for re-cementation. If you choose to put the crown back on the tooth, be careful not to accidentally swallow it.

Many times, when a crown becomes loose, it is due to additional decay underneath the crown. If this is the case, you may need a new crown, root canal therapy, or extraction.

\*If any of the above events occur, schedule with your dentist immediately. Resolving issues quickly will allow for the best results with your dental health.\*
