



In Case Of Emergency:

Toothache or Swelling

Toothache:

Spontaneous toothaches are often the result of a large decay on the nerve of the tooth.

Take over the counter pain medication as needed and contact your dentist as soon as possible.

Minor Swelling of the Gums or Jaw:

Though there are many reasons there may be swelling or pain in the gums or jaw, the most common reasons are severe tooth decay or infection. Over the counter pain medication can be used to help until you are able to see your dentist.

You will need to be seen for an evaluation and treatment plan. In the case of an infection, antibiotics may be needed.

Severe Swelling of the Jaw and Face:

You will need to make an appointment to see your dentist immediately. If you are unable to be scheduled, we recommend going to the emergency room. Often times, antibiotics are needed for this type of reaction and could be a result of a severe infection.

If any of the above events occur, schedule with your dentist immediately. Resolving issues quickly will allow for the best results with your dental health.
